Abir Moussi

Your Excellency,

I am deeply concerned about the arbitrary incarceration of the Tunisian Citizen Abir Moussi. On 5th August 2024, a Tunis Court had sentenced Abir Moussi to two years in prison because she had publicly criticized the legislative electoral process as being unconstitutional (the Court had filed an ISIE complaint under Decree-Law 54). On 22nd November 2024, the Tunis Court of Appeals reduced her sentence from two years to 16 months, which means that having served and completed her sentence on 26th May 2025, she should finally have been released from prison.

However, on 12th June 2025, the same court sentenced her in a separate trial to an additional two years in prison (following a second ISIE complaint, also under Decree-Law 54). In a further trial, Abir Moussi was even sentenced to twelve years' imprisonment on 12th December 2025, being reproached for – allegedly – aiming at an armed rebellion to change the constitution.

I urge you to immediately release Abir Moussi, who has been behind bars since October 2023 solely for peacefully exercising her human rights. All charges against her should be dropped and her sentence overturned, as the opposition politician is imprisoned solely for her peaceful criticism of electoral procedures in Tunisia.
